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WHEREAS in 2020 the Board began a review of the petroleum products pricing in Labrador
and, on November 25, 2020, issued Order No. P.P. 58(2020) approving:
i) the implementation of a suspension of maximum price adjustments in Zones 10, 11,

- i) the implementation of a suspension of maximum price adjustments in Zones 10, 11, 11b and 12 for all fuels, with the exception of propane heating fuel;
- ii) a change to the benchmark used in maximum prices for stove oil heating fuel in all zones in Labrador, except Zones 11a and 14 where price adjustments were suspended; and

iii) interim increases in the zone differentials as set out below:

WHEREAS no changes were made to the zone differentials in Zones 11a, 13, 13a and 14 in Order No. P.P. 58(2020) as further information related to Zones 13 and 13a was pending at the time and the maximum price adjustments in Zones 11a and 14 were suspended for the winter; and

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WHEREAS in Order No. P.P. 19(2021), following the transition of the North Atlantic Refinery into standby mode, the Board approved interim adjustments, effective as of May 6, 2021, to the total allowed mark-ups for propane heating fuel in all zones in the province, except Zones 11a and 14, where maximum price adjustments were suspended, and Zones 12, 13 and 13a which were not affected by the changes at the refinery; and

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WHEREAS in Order No. P.P. 22(2021) the Board approved the lifting of the suspension of maximum price adjustments, effective as of May 6, 2021, for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel in Zones 10, 11 and 11b and for gasoline motor fuel in Zone 12; and

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WHEREAS delivery information provided by suppliers to the region shows that the spring resupply of diesel motor fuel and stove oil heating fuel to Zone 12 and of all fuels to Zones 11a and 14 has commenced and will be completed in the coming days and, therefore, the Board is satisfied that it is reasonable to lift the suspension of maximum price adjustments for these fuels in these zones, effective June 10, 2021; and

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WHEREAS the Board is also satisfied that, with the lifting of the suspension in Zones 11a and
14, the maximum prices in these zones should reflect the change to the stove oil benchmark
which was accepted in Order No. P.P. 58(2020), as well as changes to the total allowed mark-ups
for propane heating fuel consistent with the decisions made in Order No. P.P. 19(2021); and

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WHEREAS based on the cost information provided during the 2020 Labrador Petroleum Products Pricing Review, including the information provided by suppliers in the region in the spring of 2021, the Board is satisfied that the zone differentials reflected in the current wholesale mark-ups are inadequate to recover the cost of supply for certain fuels in Zones 10, 11, 11a, 11b, 12 and 14 and that the zone differentials should be adjusted on an interim basis; and

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34 WHEREAS the review of information with respect to the zone differentials in Zones 13 and 13a 35 is ongoing and there will be no changes at this time with respect to these zones; and WHEREAS based on the commentary provided during the 2020 Labrador Petroleum Products Pricing Review, including the information received from suppliers in the region in the spring of 2021, the Board is satisfied that a suspension of maximum price adjustments should be implemented with the June 10, 2021 maximum price adjustments in Zones 10, 11, 11a, 11b, 12 and 14 for all fuels except propane heating fuel until further order of the Board.

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IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

- The suspension of maximum price adjustments for diesel motor fuel and stove oil heating
 fuel in Zone 12 (Central Labrador) and for all fuels in Zone 11a (Labrador South Tanker
 Supplied) and Zone 14 (Coastal Labrador North) is lifted, effective 12:01 a.m. June 10, 2021.
- The benchmark used in maximum prices for stove oil heating fuel in Zone 11a (Coastal Labrador South – Tanker Supplied) and Zone 14 (Coastal Labrador North) shall be 100% Platts New York Barge ULSKero, effective 12:01 a.m. June 10, 2021.
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The maximum wholesale prices will be adjusted on an interim basis effective 12:01 a.m. June
 10, 2021, with corresponding changes in maximum retail prices, to reflect the following
 interim increases in zone differentials and mark-ups, until further order of the Board:

Maximum price adjustments in Zone 10 (Labrador – The Straits to Red Bay), Zone 11 (Labrador – Lodge Bay / Cartwright), Zone 11a (Coastal Labrador South – Tanker Supplied),
 Zone 11b (Coastal Labrador South – Drum Delivery), Zone 12 (Central Labrador) and Zone 14 (Coastal Labrador North) shall be suspended as of June 10, 2021 for all fuels, except propane, until further order of the Board.
