1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the *Petroleum Products*
2 *Act*, SNL 2001, Chapter P-10.1 and regulations
3 thereunder; and

5 **IN THE MATTER OF** the setting of
6 maximum prices to be charged for gasoline and
7 diesel motor fuels, and stove oil heating fuel in
8 Zones 10, 11, 11a, 11b, 12 and 14; and
9

10 **IN THE MATTER OF** the lifting of the
11 current suspension of maximum price
12 adjustments for gasoline and diesel motor fuels,
13 and stove oil heating fuel in Zones 11a and 14;

16 **IN THE MATTER OF** the suspension of
17 maximum price adjustments for gasoline and
18 diesel motor fuels, and stove oil heating fuel in
19 Zones 10, 11, 11a, 11b, 12 and 14.

22 **WHEREAS** in Order No. P.P. 38(2022) the Board approved the lifting of the suspension of
23 maximum price adjustments, effective as of May 26, 2022, for gasoline and diesel motor fuels
24 and stove oil heating fuel in Zones 10, 11 and 11b; and

26 **WHEREAS** in Order No. P.P. 43(2022) the Board approved the lifting of the suspension of
27 maximum price adjustments, effective as of June 16, 2022, for gasoline and diesel motor fuels
28 and stove oil heating fuel in Zone 12; and
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30 **WHEREAS** delivery information provided to the Board by suppliers to the region shows that the
31 spring resupply of gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel to Zones 11a and 14
32 has been completed and, as a result, the Board is satisfied that it is reasonable to lift the
33 suspension of maximum price adjustments for these fuels in these zones, effective June 30, 2022;

36 **WHEREAS** based on the information provided the Board is satisfied that it is appropriate at this
37 time to address the suspension of maximum price adjustments in Zones 10, 11, 11a, 11b, 12 and
38 14 for the upcoming spring; and

1 **WHEREAS** during the 2020 Labrador Petroleum Products Pricing Review most participants
 2 agreed that fuel prices should reflect the cost of the product and suggested that maximum price
 3 adjustments for marine tanker supplied zones should be suspended once seasonal deliveries have
 4 been established; and

 6 **WHEREAS** based on the information provided the Board is satisfied that the seasonal
 7 suspension of maximum price adjustments should be implemented until resupply of product in
 8 the Fall for all fuels, except propane heating fuel, in Zones 10, 11, 11a, 11b, 12 and 14; and

9
 10 **WHEREAS** based on available information all spring supply of product to Zones 10, 11, 11a,
 11 11b, 12 and 14 has been completed and, as such, the Board is satisfied that the suspension of
 12 maximum price adjustments for these zones should be implemented effective 12:01 a.m. June 30,
 13 2022 until further order of the Board.



 16 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

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 18 1. The suspension of maximum price adjustments for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove
 19 oil heating fuel in Zone 11a (Coastal Labrador South – Tanker Supplied) and Zone 14
 20 (Coastal Labrador North) is lifted, effective 12:01 a.m. June 30, 2022.
 21
 22 2. Maximum price adjustments for all products, with the exception of propane heating fuel in
 23 Zones 10, 11, 11a, 11b, 12 and 14 shall be suspended as of the scheduled maximum price
 24 adjustment effective 12:01 a.m. June 30, 2022, until further order of the Board.
