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13	IN THE MATTER OF changes with respect to
14	total allowed mark-ups for regulated petroleum
15	products in Labrador as a result of the Board's
16	Petroleum Products Pricing Review.
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WHEREAS on June 7, 2022, pursuant to Section 8.1(3) of the Petroleum Products Act, the Minister of Digital Government and Service NL requested that the Board review the suitability of the pricing mechanism for benchmark prices and the maximum mark-up between the wholesale price to the retailer and the retail price to the consumer for all regulated fuels; and

WHEREAS as part of the Petroleum Products Pricing Review (the "Review") the Board engaged consultants and sought information and feedback from the industry, consumers and community groups; and

WHEREAS on October 1, 2024 the Board issued a consultation document for industry and public input which outlined potential changes to benchmarking, mark-ups and zone differentials, and other pricing matters, for Labrador; and

WHEREAS on March 13, 2025, the Board issued a final report for Labrador which outlined in detail the changes to petroleum products pricing to be implemented in Labrador, including the Board's rationale and implementation plan for those changes; and

WHEREAS the Board considered all information and feedback provided by its consultants, the industry, consumers and community groups during the Review and concluded that for Labrador:

• Wholesale mark-ups for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel will be adjusted in all Labrador pricing zones to align with the wholesale mark-ups implemented on the Island portion of the Province in Order No. P.P. 6(2025);

• Zone differentials for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel will be decreased in all Labrador pricing zones to reflect the net impact of:

o changes to offset the wholesale mark-up increases; and,

o changes to reflect cost increases since the differentials were last adjusted;

 Increases to the retail mark-ups for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel in all Labrador pricing zones are warranted;

 The resulting changes to mark-ups and zone differentials should be phased-in weekly over a period of 5 weeks;

 Adjustments to the total allowed mark-ups and zone differentials for propane heating fuel in Labrador are warranted;

 Zone 11b - Coastal Labrador South (Drum Delivery) should be combined with Zone 11a - Coastal Labrador South (Tanker Supplied) at Zone 11a's pricing.
 The Town of Cartwright should be established as a new pricing zone 11c in Labrador,

with new zone differentials reflecting the cost of supply;

• Maximum prices should continue to be adjusted seasonally based on actual acquisition

costs in marine tanker supplied areas of Labrador;
The effective day of weekly maximum price adjustments should move to Friday instead of Thursday for Zones 13 and 13a;

• Argus Media-reported market data should replace Platts US Marketscan-reported market data in the calculation of average benchmark prices for Zones 13 and 13a;

• A 5-day average, rather than a 7-day average, should be used in the calculation of benchmark prices for Zones 13 and 13a; and

 A new diesel motor fuel blend schedule should be implemented commencing in the fall of 2025 for Zones 13 and 13a; and

WHEREAS in Order No. P.P. 18(2025) the Board lifted the suspension of maximum price adjustments for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel in Zones 10, 11, 11a, 12 and 14 to implement changes flowing from the Review; and

WHEREAS in Order No. P.P. 19(2025) the Board commenced the implementation of the changes flowing from the Review for Labrador, including mark-up and zone differential changes for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil and propane heating fuels in Labrador; and

WHEREAS in Order No. P.P. 21(2025) the Board continued the implementation of the changes flowing from the Review for Labrador, including retail mark-up changes for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel; and

WHEREAS in Order No. P.P. 26(2025) further changes flowing from the Review for Labrador were implemented by the Board, including retail mark-up changes for gasoline and diesel motor fuels and stove oil heating fuel; and

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WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that the implementation of the mark-up changes should continue and therefore retail mark-ups for gasoline and diesel motor fuels in Labrador should change accordingly.

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IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

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1. The total allowed mark-ups for gasoline and diesel motor fuels, as set out in Schedule A to this Order, are approved for Labrador effective 12:01 a.m. Friday, April 11, 2025.
