Daily Adjustment of Maximum Prices for Regulated Petroleum Products

Effective 12:01 a.m. Friday, July 10, 2026 the Public Utilities Board set maximum prices for regulated petroleum products in all areas of the province except where maximum price adjustments have been suspended. The changes to maximum prices reflect recent changes in market commodity prices.

The changes to maximum fuel prices are as follows:

- all types of gasoline motor fuel will increase by up to 4.8 cents per litre (“cpl”);
- diesel motor fuel on the Island will increase by up to 14.7 cpl;
- diesel motor fuel in Zones 13 and 13a in Labrador will increase by 11.1 cpl;
- furnace oil heating fuel on the Island will increase by 12.77 cpl;
- stove oil heating fuel in Zones 13 and 13a in Labrador will increase by 8.64 cpl; and
- propane heating fuel will decrease by 0.6 cpl.

These changes are based on the most recently available average market data as of the close of business on July 8, and as a result do not reflect more recent market activity.

The Board’s next price adjustment is on Saturday, July 11, 2026.
