  19 WHEREAS Hydro is a corporation continued and existing under the *Hydro Corporation Act*, is
- 20 a public utility within the meaning of the Act, and is subject to the provisions of the EPCA; and

WHEREAS on December 20, 2007 Hydro filed the within application with the Board seeking approval of these new rates for the sale of power and energy to Island Interconnected customers (Rate Class 1.1, 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4 and 4.1), Isolated Rural Domestic customers, excluding Government departments (Rate Class 1.2D), Isolated Rural General Service customers, excluding Government departments, (Rate Class 2.1D and 2.2D), and Isolated Rural street and area lighting (Rate Class 4.1D), to be implemented effective January 1, 2008 (the "Application"); and

- WHEREAS on December 24, 2007 the Board issued Order No. P.U. 35(2007) approving the proposals set out in the application on an interim basis, effective January 1, 2008, noting that given the timing of the application there was insufficient time to finalize the application; and

- 33 WHEREAS the Board asked its financial consultants, Grant Thornton, to review the proposals set
- out in the within application to ensure that the proposals are proper and in accordance with OrderNo. P.U. 8(2007); and

WHEREAS on February 22, 2008 the Board received a report from Grant Thornton concluding that
 the rates are properly calculated and are in compliance with Order No. P.U. 8(2007); and

WHEREAS on February 29, 2008 the Board provided a copy of the Grant Thornton report and
 invited comments from Hydro, the Consumer Advocate, Newfoundland Power and the island
 industrial customers of Hydro; and

8 **WHEREAS** the Board did not receive any additional information or feedback in relation to this 9 application in response to the request for comments: and

WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that it the proposed rates, rules and regulations are accurate and consistent with previous orders of the Board and Orders in Council issued by Government, it is reasonable and appropriate to approve on a final basis the proposed rates, rules and regulations, effective January 1, 2008; and

 on an interim basis in Order No. P.U. 35(2007), should be confirmed, there is no finding of excess

\$7.46 per kVA of billing demand in the months of December, January, February and March and \$5.96 per kVA in all other months. The billing demand shall be the maximum demand registered on the meter in the current month.
