AN ORDER OF THE BOARD

1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the *Electrical Power*
2 *Control Act, 1994*, SNL 1994, Chapter E-5.1
3 (the “*EPCA*”) and the *Public Utilities Act*, RSNL
4 1990, Chapter P-47 (the “*Act*”), as amended,
5 and regulations thereunder; and

7 **IN THE MATTER OF** an application by
8 Newfoundland Power Inc. for approval of a
9 Contribution in Aid of Construction for a
10 single-phase extension to the Riverbank Road
11 Phase 2 Cottage Area, pursuant to section 41
12 of the *Act*.

15 **WHEREAS** Newfoundland Power Inc. (“Newfoundland Power”) is a corporation duly
16 organized and existing under the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public
17 utility within the meaning of the *Act*, and is also subject to the provisions of the *EPCA*; and

19 **WHEREAS** on March 15, 2018 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a
20 Contribution in Aid of Construction (“CIAC”) for a single-phase extension of approximately
21 1,421 metres (the “Extension”) to serve Domestic Customers located in a cottage area known as
22 Riverbank Road Phase 2 Cottage Area, near the town of Bishop’s Falls; and

24 **WHEREAS** the CIAC, calculated in accordance with Clause 5(a) of the CIAC Policy:
25 Distribution Line Extensions to Domestic Customers approved by Order No. P.U. 27(2005) (the
26 “Policy”) is six thousand six hundred forty-three dollars and fourteen cents (\$6,643.14),
27 excluding HST; and
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29 **WHEREAS** Clause 10(i) of the Policy states all line extensions or upgrades involving CIACs
30 where the costs calculated pursuant to Clause 5(a) are estimated to be greater than \$50,000
31 require approval of the Board; and
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
33 **WHEREAS** the sum of the CIAC calculated pursuant to Clause 5(a) and the Basic Investment
34 calculated pursuant to Clause 3 is \$52,977; and
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
36 **WHEREAS** the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Newfoundland Power’s investment
37 in the Extension is compensatory over the useful life of the Extension and will not be to the
38 detriment of its other customers.


1 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

- 3 1. The Refundable Contribution in Aid of Construction of six thousand six hundred forty-
4 three dollars and fourteen cents (\$6,643.14), excluding HST, to apply to Domestic
5 Customers located in a cottage area known as Riverbank Road Phase 2 Cottage Area, near
6 the town of Bishop's Falls, is approved.

8 2. Newfoundland Power Inc. shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this
9 Application.
