AN ORDER OF THE BOARD

1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the *Electrical Power*
2 *Control Act, 1994*, SNL 1994, Chapter E-5.1
3 (the “*EPCA*”) and the *Public Utilities Act*, RSNL
4 1990, Chapter P-47 (the “*Act*”), as amended, and
5 regulations thereunder; and

7 **IN THE MATTER OF** an application by
8 Newfoundland Power Inc. for approval of a
9 Contribution in Aid of Construction for a line
10 extension to serve customers in the cottage area
11 known as Island Pond, near the Town of Colinet,
12 pursuant to section 41 of the *Act*.

15 **WHEREAS** Newfoundland Power Inc. (“Newfoundland Power”) is a corporation duly organized
16 and existing under the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility
17 within the meaning of the *Act*, and is also subject to the provisions of the *EPCA*; and

19 **WHEREAS** on March 27, 2019 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a
20 Contribution in Aid of Construction (“CIAC”) for a single-phase extension of 3,419-metres to
21 serve Domestic Customers in a cottage area located at Island Pond, near the Town of Colinet; and
22

23 **WHEREAS** six potential customers of the area (“Participating Customers”) have requested that
24 Newfoundland Power provide electrical service; and
25

26 **WHEREAS** the Participating Customers have requested the Non-Refundable CIAC Option
27 provided for in Clause 6 of the CIAC Policy: Distribution Line Extensions to Domestic Customers
28 approved by Order No. P.U. 27(2005) (the “Policy”); and

30 **WHEREAS** the Non-Refundable CIAC for the Participating Customers, calculated in accordance
31 with Clause 6(a) of the Policy, is twelve thousand five hundred thirty dollars and fifty-three cents
32 (\$12,530.53), excluding HST; and

34 **WHEREAS** the sum of the Non-Refundable CIAC calculated pursuant to Clause 6 and the Basic
35 Investment calculated pursuant to Clause 3 is greater than \$50,000 and therefore, in accordance
36 with Clause 10 of the Policy, Board approval is required; and

1 **WHEREAS** the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Newfoundland Power’s investment is
2 compensatory over the useful life of the upgrade and will not be to the detriment of its other
3 customers.
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
6 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**
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- 8 1. The Non-Refundable Contribution in Aid of Construction of twelve thousand five hundred
9 thirty dollars and fifty-three cents (\$12,530.53), excluding HST, to provide single-phase
10 service to customers located in the cottage area known as Island Pond, near the Town of
11 Colinet, is approved.

- 13 2. Newfoundland Power shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
