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7	IN THE MATTER OF an application by
8	Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro for approval
9	of the purchase and installation of a new diesel
10	engine for the Mary's Harbour Diesel Generating
11	Station pursuant to section 41 of the <i>Act</i> .
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14	WHEREAS Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") is a corporation continued and
15	existing under the Hydro Corporation Act, 2007, is a public utility within the meaning of the Act
16	and is also subject to the provisions of the <i>EPCA</i> ; and
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18	WHEREAS section 41 of the Act states that a public utility shall not proceed with the construction
19	purchase or lease of improvements or additions to its property without prior approval of the Board
20	where a) the cost of construction or purchase is in excess of \$50,000, or b) the cost of the lease is
21	in excess of \$5,000 in a year of the lease; and
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23	WHEREAS in Order No. P.U. 37(2021) the Board approved Hydro's 2022 Capital Budget in the
24	amount of \$84,163,400; and
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26	WHEREAS the Board approved supplementary 2022 capital expenditures in:
27	(i) Order No. P.U. 9(2022) to reset Hydro's 2022 Allowance for Unforeseen Items to
28	\$1,000,000; and
29	(ii) Order No. P.U. 12(2022) in the amount of \$634,000 to replace the roof of the
30	Makkovik Diesel Generating Station; and
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32	WHEREAS on April 6, 2022 Hydro filed an application for approval to purchase and install a
33	diesel engine at the Mary's Harbour Diesel Generating Station (the "Application"); and
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35	WHEREAS the Mary's Harbour Diesel Generating Station holds two 545 kW units (Unit 2093
36	and Unit 2103) and a 725 kW unit (Unit 2104), all of which are used to provide electrical service
37	to the community; and

WHEREAS the Application stated that on March 6, 2022 Unit 2093 experienced a catastrophic engine failure that included a damaged crankshaft and connecting rod that punctured the engine block in two places; and

WHEREAS the Application stated that, without all three generating units during the winter, peak loads could exceed the firm capacity of the Mary's Harbour electrical system, resulting in outages to customers; and

WHEREAS the Application stated that Unit 2093's engine is not repairable and a replacement 545 kW engine is the most appropriate and least-cost option based upon Hydro's evaluation of alternatives; and

WHEREAS the Application was copied to: Newfoundland Power Inc. ("Newfoundland Power"); the Consumer Advocate, Dennis Browne, Q.C.; a group of Island Industrial customers: Corner Brook Pulp and Paper Limited, Braya Renewable Fuels (Newfoundland) GP Inc. (formerly known as NARL Refining Limited Partnership), and Vale Newfoundland and Labrador Limited; and the communities of Sheshatshiu, Happy Valley-Goose Bay, Wabush, and Labrador City ("Labrador Interconnected Group"); and

WHEREAS on April 13, 2022 the Board submitted a request for information ("RFI") and on April 14, 2022 the Labrador Interconnected Group submitted an RFI, both of which were responded to by Hydro on April 20, 2022; and

WHEREAS on April 26, 2022 Newfoundland Power advised that it did not have any comment on the Application; and

WHEREAS on April 27, 2022 Hydro requested that the Board approve the Application as submitted; and

 WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that the proposed 2022 supplemental capital expenditure to purchase and install a 545 kW diesel engine at the Mary's Harbour Diesel Generating Station is necessary to enable the continued supply of reliable power to Mary's Harbour.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. The proposed capital expenditure in the amount of \$137,700 to purchase and install a 545 kW diesel engine at the Mary's Harbour Diesel Generating Station is approved.

40 2. Hydro shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
