- WHEREAS Newfoundland Power Inc. ("Newfoundland Power") is a corporation duly organized and
 existing under the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility within the
 meaning of the Act, and is also subject to the provisions of the EPCA; and
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- WHEREAS by Order No. P.U. 1(1974) the Board ordered that Newfoundland Power create a Weather Normalization Reserve to normalize purchased power costs for variations in hydroelectric production caused by varying levels of precipitation, as well as any variations in kilowatt hours sold and purchased caused by varying temperatures and wind speed; and
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- WHEREAS by Order No. P.U. 13(2013) the Board approved Section II(8) of the Rate Stabilization Clause which requires that on March 31st of each year the Rate Stabilization Account be increased or reduced by the balance in the Weather Normalization Reserve accrued in the previous year; and
- WHEREAS on February 27, 2024 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a debit
 balance in its Weather Normalization Reserve as of December 31, 2023 in the amount of \$6,321,270
 owing from customers; and
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- 31 WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that the Weather Normalization Reserve as of December 31, 2023
- 32 properly reflects the normalization of variations in revenue and expenses caused by meteorological
- 33 conditions during 2023.

1 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

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- Newfoundland Power's Weather Normalization Reserve of a debit balance of \$6,321,270 as of
 December 31, 2023 is approved.
- 6 2. Newfoundland Power shall pay all costs and expenses of the Board in connection with this7 Application.
