

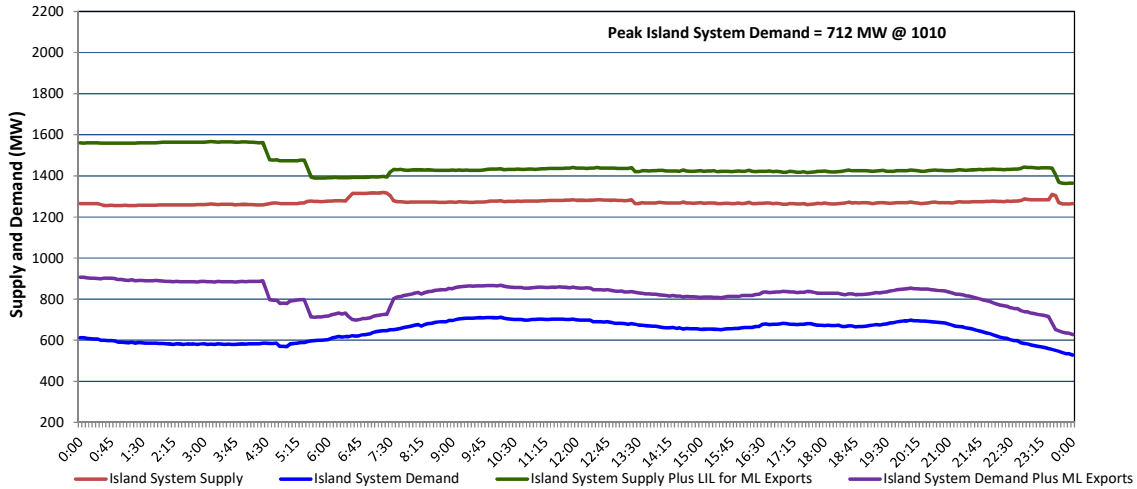

Island Supply Notes For September 13, 2026 ¹

- A As of 0800 hours, March 29, 2026, Holyrood Unit 3 unavailable due to planned outage (150 MW).
- B As of 0800 hours, May 06, 2026, Holyrood Unit 2 unavailable due to planned outage 40 MW (170 MW).
- C As of 0701 hours, May 24, 2026, Holyrood Unit 1 unavailable due to planned outage 166 MW (170 MW).
- D As of 0841 hours, May 24, 2026, Hinds Lake Unit unavailable due to planned outage (75 MW).
- E As of 0834 hours, June 15, 2026, Bay d'Espoir Unit 3 unavailable due to planned outage (76.5 MW).
- F As of 0834 hours, June 15, 2026, Bay d'Espoir Unit 4 unavailable due to planned outage (76.5 MW).
- G As of 0651 hours, September 8, 2026, Labrador Island Link available at 450 MW due to planned derating (900 MW) - Monopole.
- H As of 1610 hours, September 8, 2026, St. Anthony Diesel Plant available at 7.7 MW due to forced derating (9.7 MW).

Island Supply Notes For September 14, 2026

I At of 0532 hours, September 14, 2026, Labrador Island Link unavailable due to a planned outage (900 MW) - Bipole.

- Notes:
1. Generation outages for running and corrective maintenance are included. These are not unusual for power system operations. They generally do not impact customer supply. Hydro schedules outages to system equipment whenever possible to coincide with periods when customer demands are low and sufficient supply reserves are available. However, from time to time equipment outages are necessary and reserves may be impacted.
 2. As of 0800 Hours.
 3. Gross continuous unit output.
 4. Gross output from all Island sources (including Note 3).
 5. NLH Island Power Purchases include: ML Imports, Exploits Generation, Rattle Brook, Star Lake, Wind Generation and capacity assistance (when applicable).
 6. Adjusted for interruptible load and the impact of voltage reduction when applicable.
 7. Due to limitations inherent in the design of combustion turbines, the output of combustion turbines may be reduced in the event that ambient temperatures exceed the threshold required for full rated output. This threshold is dependent on the design of each turbine.
 8. Does not include ML Exports.
 9. LIL Import sunk in the Island System. Actual LIL flows will be restricted by various system conditions including, but not limited to, Island Load, ML Exports and Avalon Unit status.
 10. Run-of-river hydro resources are subject to hydrological variability. Reported firm capacity reflects the capacity expected to be available during peak demand periods.
