**Re: The Board's Investigation and Hearing into Supply Issues and Power Outages on the Island Interconnected System – Revised Process**

This is further to the Board's letter of October 8<sup>th</sup>, 2014 regarding a revised process for the Board's Investigation and Hearing into Supply Issues and Power Outages on the Island Interconnected System (the "Investigation"). In its letter, the Board indicated that the Investigation will be divided into two phases. Phase One will address the immediate reliability issues for the Island Interconnected system prior to interconnection with Muskrat Falls. Phase Two will address reliability issues after the Muskrat Falls interconnection.

The Board has requested Newfoundland Power to identify any current outstanding information requests that are deemed essential for completion of Phase One of the Investigation. On September 19, 2014 Newfoundland Power submitted Requests for Information NP-NLH-1 to NP-NLH-35 to the Board. These Requests for Information relate to reliability issues after the Muskrat Falls interconnection has been established and are therefore not essential for completion of Phase One of the Investigation.

On October 15, 2014 Newfoundland Power responded to Requests for Information PUB-NP-308 to PUB-NP-311 and CA-NP-016 to CA-NP-024. There are currently no outstanding Requests for Information remaining to be filed by Newfoundland Power relating to the Investigation.



Newfoundland Power observes that the following Requests for Information are currently outstanding and are related to Phase One of the Investigation:
