Our *Fourteenth Quarterly Monitoring Report on the Integration of Power Supply Facilities to the Island Interconnected System* noted that we continued as of March 11 to await responses from Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro (Hydro) to a series of written questions we posed on February 14, 2022. The Board, in a letter dated, March 16, 2022, directed Hydro to respond to those questions.


Hydro provided written responses on March 24. Our review of them disclosed no information that would call into question any of the findings or conclusions of our March 11 report. Nor did they raise additional concerns of immediate moment. However, they do relate to matters of continuing importance and interest as we continue the quarterly monitoring process.

The responses came just as we had begun preparing for the next meetings with Hydro as part of our monitoring process. That timing makes it efficient and timely to use the imminently following meetings to follow up on a number of the responses. Moreover, other of our questions cover matters of continuing interest, which means we will be seeking updated information about them as we proceed.

Given the timing and nature of the responses, we believe that our next sessions with Hydro will permit timely completion of those follow-ups and updates, with the results addressed in the report to the Board that will follow.

For now, therefore, we do not anticipate any amendment to our March 11 report.
