Q. Please confirm that Hydro's proposed regionalized diesel plant design will integrate and supply
power to the Fish Plant in Pinsent's Arm, currently supplied by a diesel generator.

A.

Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's proposed regional diesel plant and regional interconnection of the communities of southern Labrador will include the interconnection of the Charlottetown, Mary's Harbour, Port Hope Simpson, and St. Lewis distribution systems, which also serve the communities of Pinsent's Arm and Lodge's Bay. The extent of modifications to the existing distribution system is limited to those which are required to modify the voltage to accommodate the regional interconnection, and does not include the interconnection of customers not presently connected, nor upgrades from single-phase to three-phase services. Any customer who wishes to be interconnected, can choose to do so. Service extensions and upgrades are governed by the Contributions In Aid of Construction Policy¹ approved by the Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities, which requires that customers pay a contribution towards these upgrades, the value of which is calculated as outlined in the policy.
