The topography and shape of Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's ("Hydro") current site does not allow for a new plant of the required size to be built on this location without site expansion. 10 As there is no adjacent land available for Hydro to acquire or expand onto, site expansion is not 11 12 an option. Additionally, the current site is not an optimal location for a larger regional generating station. It is located in the heart of the community, surrounded by private homes, 13 14 roads, a fish plant, and the ocean. Based on feedback Hydro has received from residents in the 15 community regarding issues with noise levels coming from the existing generating station, Hydro expects that the community would not be accepting of Hydro rebuilding a larger, regional 16 17 facility on the same site.
