8	A.	The Canadian Off-Grid Utility Association ("COGUA") is in the process of being rebranded as the
9		North American Off-Grid Utility Association to reflect the membership of utilities from outside
10		Canada; as such, no website is available for the COGUA.
11		Member organizations in the COGUA include:

1 The COGUA has no employees; it is a partnership between the utilities to share information 2 related to off-grid energy production, including successes and challenges related to day-to-day operations and project execution. 3 A director is appointed by each utility; each of which forms the Board of Directors, which meets 4 monthly. There are also two subcommittees that meet to discuss items that are more specific— 5 6 namely the renewables committee and the engine reliability committee. There is a conference 7 every 18 months at which time utilities provide updates on their operations and present on a 8 relevant topic of their choosing. Throughout the year, it is quite common for members to email 9 the group seeking input or advice from other group member utilities.
