1 Q. Is there a way for the Board to expedite the application for Capital Expenditures that would
2 essentially eliminate any perceived benefits from filing the Early Execution Capital Work
3 application?

A. Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") does not believe that there is a feasible way for the Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities ("Board") to expedite the 2025 Build Application to eliminate the need for the Early Execution Application.

As stated in Hydro's 2025 Build Application,¹ the estimated completion timelines of the Bay d'Espoir Unit 8 and Avalon Combustion Turbine projects in 2031 and 2029, respectively, align with Hydro's resource planning outlook and enables the earliest possible retirement of aging assets, including Holyrood Thermal Generating Station. These timelines assume that the Early Execution Application is approved in April 2025 to allow for project continuity while the Board and parties consider the 2025 Build Application and to mitigate risks associated with supply chain delays and market pressures while that review is underway.

Hydro's timelines, noted above, assume approval is received for the 2025 Build Application in the fourth quarter of 2025.² The 2025 Build Application requests approval of a significant investment into vital infrastructure, and Hydro acknowledges and agrees that substantive review by the Board and parties is necessary. It is not reasonable to expect the review of the 2025 Build Application to be complete on the timeline that is necessary to proceed with the capital expenditures noted in the Early Execution Application, and approvals for either application later than estimated will introduce delays in project schedule that risk pushing project completion into future years at additional cost to customers.

The project schedule assumes time for a thorough review and evaluation of the project through a 2025 Build Application regulatory proceeding necessary to obtain Board approval by the end of the fourth guarter of 2025.
