What about in 2024? 10 11 12 A. a) The Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities ("Board") issued provisional Capital Budget Application Guidelines ("Guidelines") that provide guidance on the protocol to be followed 13 14 for multi-year projects. Specifically, the Guidelines state: "The proposed expenditures for each year of a multi-year project will be 15 16 considered together in the initial year of the application. Where a utility 17 confirms in its capital budget application in subsequent years that the scope, 18 nature and magnitude of the project continues to be consistent with the original 19 approval, further approval of the project is not required. If there is a material 20 change in a subsequent year the expenditures will be subject to further review. 21 A change will be considered material if the nature or scope of the project 22 changes such that that original rationale provided is no longer applicable or 23 where the revised forecast expenditure exceeds the approved amount by 10% 24 or more." 25 The Guidelines do not provide guidance on when a utility is required to advise the Board in 26 the event that a single-year project, or multi-year project in the final year of its execution, is 27 forecast to exceed the approved budget. Historically, Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro 28 ("Hydro") has proceeded with execution and advised the Board in its annual Capital
