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- Q. If it is determined that it may not be economically justifiable to invest in the life 2 extension of a hydro production facility, provide an explanation of the process to 3 decommission the hydro plant and an outline of the costs that would be incurred 4 upon decommissioning and abandonment.
- 6 A. Newfoundland Power undertakes assessments of its hydro production facilities to 7 determine if their continued operation is economically justifiable and consistent with the 8 Company's obligation to provide reliable service to customers at least cost. If it is 9 determined that continued operation of a hydro production facility is no longer 10 economically justifiable Newfoundland Power would undertake a detailed site specific evaluation of the costs of decommissioning the hydro production facility. 11

Newfoundland Power has provided the report 2019 Depreciation Study – Hydro Plant Decommissioning Report as Attachment A to response to Request for Information CA-NP-021. The report provides a detailed description of the requirements to decommission a hydro production facility and estimates of the associated costs. Costs associated with environmental cleanup or habitat restoration are not included. These costs are site specific and require a detailed study to produce an accurate site specific cost estimate.1

In addition to site reinstatement, there may be ongoing obligations required for maintaining the water flows and water storage levels associated with facility infrastructure including the reservoir, penstock, tailrace, and spillway.<sup>2</sup> The full extent of any Newfoundland Power obligations would be identified through engagement of regulatory bodies and other stakeholders and be detailed in a site specific decommissioning study.

If decommissioning and abandonment of a hydro production facility is required, Newfoundland Power would submit an application to the Board in accordance with the abandonment of plant provisions in the *Public Utilities Act.* Relevant information pertaining to the economic justification, associated costs, and any other obligations would be provided to the Board in support of the application.

Depending on the location of the hydro plant and associated equipment, ongoing obligations may be required for water supply, flood control, and recreational purposes.
