b) The New Services program involves the installation of service wires to connect new customers to the electrical distribution system. In general, these installation costs are within the definition of the Company's basic investment, as outlined in its Residential and General Service CIAC Policies, requiring no contribution from the customer towards the capital cost.1

For the definition of the Company's basic investment, see sections three of the Contribution in Aid of Construction Policy: Distribution Line Extensions to Domestic Customers and the Contribution in Aid of Construction Policy: Distribution Line Extensions and Upgrades to General Service Customers, filed with the Board on January 27, 2025. If the cost to provide a service exceeds the Company's basic investment, a contribution in aid of construction ("CIAC") is required from the customer. For example, a CIAC is required when the requested service involves underground installation or is located away from the nearest practical point on the distribution system. With respect to CIAC amounts, all contributions received from customers are recorded as reductions against Newfoundland Power's net plant investment when calculating rate base. The Company does not record customer contributions as being part of a specific capital program.
