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1 **Q**: (Liberty December 17, 2014 Report to Board on Supply Issues and Power 2 Outages Review Island Interconnected System addressing Newfoundland and 3 Labrador Hydro) Recommendation 2.13 (e) states (Appendix A, page A-3): 4 "Report to the Board immediately whenever forecast reserves fall under 10 5 percent during any day". It appears that reporting a percentage reserve margin 6 has many of the same issues as using an LOLH criterion. Would use of a 7 reporting system similar to that outlined on pages 90 and 91 of Liberty's 8 report relating to Newfoundland Power not be a more consistent and 9 functional means for presenting information to the Board?

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12 The system referred to from the Newfoundland Power report would be a "more A. 13 consistent and functional means for presenting information to the Board." Moreover, such a system is identical to the one included in Hydro's T-001 (see the 14 15 response to CA-PUB-18), which provides what will be used under the Joint Storm/Outage Protocol (PUB-NLH-304) in reporting to the Board. Liberty does not 16 17 agree that "reporting a percentage reserve has many of the same issues as using an LOLH criterion." Both approaches have their place; however, Liberty's report 18 19 explains why the reserve figure should be of greatest interest in Newfoundland and 20 Labrador over the next few years.
