1	Q.	Please provide information on the nature and quantity of interruptible
2		Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro customers.
3		
4		
5	A.	Hydro has three classes of customers: industrial, utility and rural. The following is a
6		discussion of interruptible customers by class:
7		
8		<u>Industrial</u>
9		Finalized in December 2013, Hydro has an arrangement with Corner Brook Pulp and
10		Paper Limited for short-term capacity assistance. The arrangement, which is in
11		place until March 31, 2014, allows for Hydro to call on progressively increasing
12		blocks of capacity from Corner Brook Pulp and Paper's 60 Hz generation (20 MW, 40
13		MW and 60 MW). These blocks are made available in four-hour periods through
14		interruption of load at the Corner Brook Paper Mill. For details of this arrangement
15		refer to Hydro's response to PUB-NLH-048.
16		
17		Hydro has held discussions with North Atlantic Refining and Vale about similar
18		interruptible arrangements. To date, Hydro has not made any formal arrangements
19		with these customers.
20		
21		In addition, each Industrial Customer has an amount of interruptible power under
22		its service agreement with Hydro. At present, none of these are greater than 5 MW
23		and the total amount of interruptible power available is 10 MW. Since the amount
24		of interruptible power actually taken by these customers is generally quite low, the
25		practical impact of this provision on peak is usually negligible.
