**IN THE MATTER OF** the *Automobile* 1 2 Insurance Act, RSNL 1990, c. A-22, as 3 amended (the "Act"); 4 5 AND 6 7 **IN THE MATTER OF** an application by 8 Dominion of Canada General Insurance Company 9 to implement a revised rating program for its 10 Private Passenger Automobiles class of business. 11 12 13 WHEREAS on November 10, 2011 Dominion of Canada General Insurance Company applied 14 to the Board for approval of a revised automobile insurance rating program for its Private 15 Passenger Automobiles class of business; and 16 17 **WHEREAS** the rating program proposes rates that are higher than those currently approved by 18 the Board; and 19 20 WHEREAS on November 22, 2011 the Board's consulting actuaries, Oliver Wyman, filed a 21 report of findings with the Board identifying that the rate proposal was not fully supported; and 22 23 WHEREAS on November 23, 2011 the Board provided Dominion of Canada General Insurance 24 Company with a copy of the Oliver Wyman report and requested additional support for its rate 25 proposal; and 26 27 WHEREAS on December 30, 2011, January 11, 2012 and January 17, 2012 Dominion of 28 Canada General Insurance Company filed revised rate proposals with the Board; and 29 30 WHEREAS on January 17, 2012 Oliver Wyman filed an addendum to its November 22, 2011 31 report to confirm that the January 17, 2012 rate proposal was supported; and 32 33 **WHEREAS** the Board is satisfied that the proposed rates are not too high in the circumstances.

## 1 IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. The revised rate proposal received January 17, 2012 from Dominion of Canada General

4 Insurance Company for its Private Passenger Automobiles class of business is approved to be 5 effective no sooner than February 1, 2012 for new business and April 1, 2012 for renewals.
