11	WHEREAS on September 16, 2013 Co-operators General Insurance Company applied to the
12	Board for approval of a revised rating program for its Motorcycles class of business; and

14	WHEREAS the rating program proposes rates for certain coverages that are higher than those
15	currently approved by the Board; and

17	WHEREAS on October 10, 2013 Board staff notified Co-operators General Insurance Company
18	of a number of issues with its proposed rating program; and

20	WHEREAS on November 20, 2013 Co-operators General Insurance Company filed a revised
21	rating program with the Board in response to issues indentified by Board staff; and
22	
23	WHEREAS on December 9, 2013 the Board's consulting actuaries, Oliver Wyman, filed a
24	report which found the proposed rate level indications to be reasonable based on the information
25	provided with the filing; and

27	WHEREAS Co-operators General Insurance Company confirmed it had no additional comments
28	on Oliver Wyman's report; and

WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that the proposed rates are not too high in the circumstances.

<u>IT</u>	IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:
1.	The revised rating program received November 20, 2013 from Co-operators General Insurance Company is approved to be effective no sooner than January 15, 2014 for both new business and renewals.
2.	Co-operators General Insurance Company will be required to pay the costs of the Board associated with this filing, including the costs of the actuarial review.
